compact urban centers own shows individually consume less oil electricity and water than other americans they live in smaller spaces discard less trash and most important of all spend far less time in automobiles residents of manhattan the most densely populated place in north america rank first in public transit use and last in percapita greenhouse gas production and they consume gasoline at a rate that the country as a whole hasn't matched since the mid 1920s when the most widely owned car in the united states was the ford model t they are also among the only people in the united states for whom walking is still an important means of daily transportation these achievements are not accidents spreading people thinly across the countryside may make them feel green but it doesn't reduce the damage they do to the environment in fact it increases the damage while also making the problems they cause harder to see and to address owen contends that the environmental problem we face at the current stage of our assault on the world's nonrenewable resources is not how to make teeming cities more like the pristine countryside the problem is how to make other settled places more like manhattan whose residents presently come closer than any other americans to meeting environmental goals that all of us eventually will have to come to terms with

a history of relations between britain and russia from the nineteenth century to the present with riddle mystery and enigma statesman and author david owen tells the story of britain s relationship with russia which has been surprisingly underexplored through his characteristic insight and expertise he depicts a relationship governed by principle as often as by suspicion expediency and necessity when the two nations formed a pragmatic alliance and fought together at the battle of navarino in greece in 1827 it was overwhelmingly the work of the british prime minister george canning his death brought about a drastic shift that would see the countries fighting on opposite sides in the crimean war and jostling for power during the great game it was not until the russian revolution of 1917 that another statesman had a defining impact on relations between britain and russia winston churchill who opposed bolshevism yet never stopped advocating for diplomatic and military engagement with russia in the second world war he recognized early on the necessity of allying with the soviets against the menace of nazi germany bringing us into the twenty first century owen chronicles how both countries have responded to their geopolitical decline drawing on both imperial and soviet history he explains the unique nature of putin s autocracy and addresses britain s return to blue water diplomacy newly revised this paperback edition features extended chapters on putin s russia and the future of british russian relations after the russo ukrainian war

for some politicians and business leaders power can become an intoxicating drug and can affect their actions and decision making in a most serious way the ancient greeks called it hubris and identified arrogance and contempt for others opinions as classic traits they also took comfort in the knowledge that the gods would punish the guilty ones nemesis in this revised edition david owen has drawn on new material he has written in brain and other medical journals he has also drawn on published memoirs of the main players in the iraq war and on evidence given to the iraq inquiry all this reinforces his earlier assertion that george w bush and tony blair developed hubris syndrome during their terms in office from their behavior beliefs and governing style owen has analyzed the two leaders with particular reference to the iraq war to show that their handling of the war was a litany of hubristic incompetence during blair s premiership david owen had several meetings and conversations with him that afforded a unique insight into his modus operandi in this book owen presents a devastating critique of how blair and bush manipulated intelligence ignored informed advice and failed to plan for the aftermath of regime change in iraq their messianic manner excessive confidence and belief that they would be vindicated by a higher court brought chaos to iraq and resulted in hundreds of thousands of civilian casualties

david owen explores hume s account of reason and its role in human understanding seen in the context of other notable accounts by philosophers of the early modern period many of the most famous problems that hume discusses and many of the positions that he advocates are expressed in terms of reason it is central to his arguments about induction belief scepticism the passions and moral distinctions to understand hume s influential views on these matters we must understand what his view of reason is the book begins with chapters on the theories of reasoning put forward by hume s notable predecessors descartes and locke owen shows that hume followed them in rejecting a formal deductive account of inference in favour of a new naturalistic account but he went farther in what we now call the argument concerning induction by showing that no account of reason as a separate faculty could explain our inferences to beliefs in the unobserved hume offers instead an associationist account of probable reasoning and a new theory of belief the picture of reason as an independent faculty is replaced with an explanation of reasoning in terms of properties of the imagination hume s reason offers a new interpretation of some of hume s central ideas and a treatment of reason which will be illuminating not just to historians of modern philosophy but to all philosophers who are concerned with the workings of human cognition
